

Navigating Electric Vehicle Charging Station Regulations



UNDERSTANDING EVCS REGULATIONS & OWNERSHIP

New commercial Electric Vehicle Charging Stations (EVCS) must be:

1. Type Approved under California Type Evaluation Program (CTEP); use CTEP Certificates of Approval Database
2. Placed in Service by a Registered Service Agency or County Sealer of Weights and Measures.
3. Tested by County Agriculture/Weights and Measures
4. Display a County approval seal

EXEMPTIONS:

- **AC EVCS:** Units in service before January 1st, 2021, are exempt until January 1st, 2031.
- **DC EVCS:** Installations prior to January 1st, 2023, are exempt until January 1st, 2033, or until replaced by new EVCS meters.

EMPOWERING ELECTRIC VEHICLE CHARGING GROWTH



As EVCSs rapidly expand, County Agriculture/Weights and Measures (AWM) must ensure that the EVCSs are accurate, the equipment is Type Evaluated (certified for commercial purposes), and installed by a licensed registered service agent.

WHO REGULATES EVCS?



California Department of Agriculture-Division of Measurement Standards (CDFA-DMS) and County Agriculture/Weights and Measures Departments in California regulate EVCS. All commercial EVCS must be registered and tested by each County AWM unless they are exempt.

APPLICATIONS EXEMPT FROM REGULATION



- Public Utilities, Entities, and Municipalities
- Non-Commercial and Workplace Charging
- Free Electricity Dispensing
- Wholesale Electricity Delivery



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
